Security assurances

Working paper submitted by China

The Chinese delegation hereby requests that the following elements be incorporated in the report of Main Committee I and the Final Document of the Review Conference.

1. In order to free the world from the threat of nuclear weapons and the risk of nuclear war, all nuclear weapons should be subject to complete prohibition and thorough destruction. Before this objective is achieved, all nuclear-weapon States should undertake not to be the first to use nuclear weapons and not to use or threaten to use nuclear weapons against non-nuclear-weapon States or nuclear-weapon-free zones at any time or under any circumstances.
2. Legally binding security assurances by nuclear-weapon States to non-nuclear-weapon States are conducive to strengthening the international nuclear non-proliferation regime. International legally binding instruments on these issues should be concluded as early as possible.
3. Nuclear-weapon States should reduce the role of nuclear weapons in their national security policies and not list any countries as targets of nuclear strikes.
4. Nuclear-weapon States should support the efforts of non-nuclear-weapon States to establish nuclear-weapon-free zones and undertake corresponding obligations.
5. The Conference on Disarmament should re-establish an ad hoc committee on negative security assurances and start substantive work and negotiations without delay.
